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Should Suppliers Provide Security?

Following yesterday's story about start-up carrier Kiwi Regional Airlines, TAANZ chief executive Andrew Olsen is asking if it's time for suppliers to provide agents with security to protect them against collapse.

The TAANZ boss is making reference to Ewan Wilson's failed Kiwi Airlines operation, which went into voluntary liquidation in 1996 leaving passengers stranded on both sides of the Tasman. "Any supplier who wants to work through an agency is recognising the strength of the travel agency distribution channel," says Olsen. "Currently travel agents make up their own minds about the inherent risk of trading with

suppliers, but TAANZ would remind its members that only, and in some cases not all, consumers are covered if a supplier fails, not agents themselves. Agents have to time and time again foot bills for failed suppliers.

"That raises the question, is it time suppliers provided agents with security that can be called upon if they fail?" muses the TAANZ boss.

... 'He's Dreaming'

It is not the only feedback *Travel Today* fielded from industry sources, from consultants to airline commentators, in response to Wilson's plans.

While most of those responses are not in fact printable, the feedback questioned the feasibility of the services, particularly with no through connection to international services as well as the probability of consents to operate to Whenuapai. Virgin Blue attempted to operate services from the Auckland airbase in 2004 and lost heavily. The same opposition is still expected.

And as for getting agent support, says one source, 'it's a bit like that lively line from *The Castle*... 'tell him he's dreaming'.

US Air Hacker Threat

Air traffic control systems in the US are reportedly at risk of being hacked, which could potentially lead to delays, near misses or a disaster. Two US senators have written to the transportation secretary about their concerns around security vulnerabilities, saying these could compromise the safety and efficiency of the national airspace system.

CX Vs The Toddler

A family was reportedly removed from a Cathay Pacific flight from Bangkok after their three-year-old refused to put on his seatbelt. The flight was delayed while the crew tried to negotiate with the parents who wanted the child to sit on their knee. The delay in turn led other passengers to voice their disapproval at the delays, so the crew removed the family and the flight departed 27 mins late, say reports.

SYD Tourist Transport

Australia's Tourism and Transport Forum is calling for a shake-up of Sydney's public transport system to make it more tourist-friendly and bring it into line with cities like New York, Paris and Tokyo. TTF says the current system is local-focused and the government should develop a specific tourism and transport policy. It's also lobbying for the creation of a dedicated Visitor Opal card that combines unlimited public transport with entry to top attractions in the city.

Chile Volcano

Villarica Volcano in the heart of the Chilean lakes district erupted yesterday, and over 3000 people in the area have been evacuated, advises Viva Expeditions. Viva has a group in the nearby in the resort town of Pucon—they are in a safe zone and tomorrow will leave to go to Argentina. The town remains on red alert, says Viva.

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Wildlife Souvenirs: Think Twice

The government is warning travellers to 'think twice' before buying wildlife products or souvenirs overseas as they could be stung with a hefty fine or even jail.

Department of Conservation rangers have been at airports in Auckland and Christchurch and the i-SITE centre in Wellington to make travellers aware their souvenirs might derive from endangered or threatened species. Importing, exporting or re-exporting any part of protected species without appropriate permits is an offence under the Trade in Endangered Species Act.

"Recent prosecutions include an Auckland man who was fined \$12,000 for smuggling ivory into New Zealand, and a tourist who was jailed for attempting to smuggle 44 native geckos and skinks out of the country in his underwear," says Associate Minister of Conservation Nicky Wagner. "Travellers should also check labels carefully as some leather goods



are made from the skins of rare animals and many traditional medicines contain CITES-listed material such as bear bile, ginseng or rhinoceros horn."

Taupo Seeks Air Operator

Taupo District Council is seeking an air operator for the Taupo-Wellington route, with Air New Zealand stopping flights at the end of Apr. The council says it has been approached by locals concerned about what the loss of the flights might mean for the district. Discussions took place with a few potential operators with the aim of starting the service as soon as NZ left, but nothing came of these. The council is now requesting proposals and says it will consult with the community about what, if any, support it should give to secure the service.

Bali's Airport Crackdown

Balinese authorities are reportedly cracking down on smokers found lighting up in public areas of the island's Ngurah Rai Airport—staging on-airport trials to convict offenders. The law came in to effect 2012, but is only now reportedly being enforced. Balidiscovery.com says 10 smokers (including international travellers) found smoking in public areas last Thu were rounded up, taken to a make-shift court in a tented area at the domestic arrivals terminal and fined.

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Dubai Hotels In A 'Healthy State'

Dubai saw a 5.6% increase in the number of guests staying in its hotels last year, to a total of 11,629,578, according to new figures from Dubai's Department of Tourism and Commerce Marketing (DTCM).

Hotel properties saw steady year-on-year growth and significant increases across key indicators like revenue and guest nights in 2014—showing that the emirate is maintaining growth at a sustainable level, says DTCM.

Guest nights were up 7.4% from 41.58m in 2013 to 44.66 million in 2014; length of stay increased from 3.78 days to 3.84 days; and total revenues reached AED 23.9 billion, up 9.8% on 2013.

"Growth in revenue is notable, con-

sidering the 9.2% increase in available rooms in Dubai during this period," says DTCM director general Helal Saeed Almarri. "At the start of 2014, the emirate's portfolio consisted of 84,534 rooms across 611 properties; by the end of the year this had increased to 92,333 rooms across 657 properties. The figures indicate that our hospitality industry is in a healthy state and, most importantly, that the growth is sustainable, which is crucial when it comes to meeting our Vision for 2020 targets."
