More Brokers As Acceptance Grows

Travel brokers have moved from the fringe to the forefront of the New Zealand trade distribution, as an increasing number of consultants opt for the flexibility and security being a broker offers.

"We estimate broker numbers will grow 10% per annum over the next 10 years. This represents big numbers," says NZ Travel Brokers director Guy Flynn. "Consequently, the travel broker space will be a significant sector of retail distribution, if not already."

In the past brokers weren't widely accepted or understood by the wider retail sector and the suppliers, but Flynn says that has now changed. "It had to, there's still work to be done, but we are heading in the right direction."

Flynn says sales are growing strongly across the brand, which last week won the best broker group in the TAANZ NTIAs for the second year running. "It's great. This encourages people to become a broker, plus they get all of the benefits that come with being a broker like lifestyle, satisfaction, control and rewards."

... Relationships Key

Brokers are also getting noticed by major suppliers in this market, with Air New Zealand chief commercial officer Cam Wallace acknowledging the exponential growth of brokers lo-


cally. "Broking is the fastest growing area in the traditional travel agency sector, and they're also a very cost effective way of getting people into the industry, and getting mothers, and fathers, back into the workforce," he says. "Importantly it also provides opportunities for a continuation of service, where the consultant is the unique selling point...sometimes the relationship with the client is bigger than the brand."

... Broking Future

Flynn has welcomed the formation of the TAANZ Broker sub-committee. "It is an extremely positive step toward getting the progress we think is required in our sector. We need the support of TAANZ and its members." In addition he says the sector needs to focus on ability of brokers to promote themselves freely in line with TAANZ goals, while maintaining quality and security.

"We want a fair and even playing field amongst all members of the retail travel sector," says Flynn. "There are some specific challenges that need to be worked through, like where a broker can work from and security. We will get there."

The broking sector needs to work together to keep raising the bar moving forward, adds Flynn. "We need our brokers to be able to work effectively and profitably."

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TAANZ On Brokers

NZ Travel Brokers founder Steve Lee was the recipient of the TAANZ NTIA lifetime achievement award last Fri—and TAANZ boss Andrew Olsen says the award, in part, acknowledges the growing influence of travel brokers. To that end TAANZ is looking to work more closely with Kiwi brokers.

TAANZ had a draft proposal of a change to rule 12 at the upcoming AGM but says that proposal has been suspended, with a moratorium of 12 months put in place to discuss the broker channel with TAANZ members involved in broker business.

"The future of the broker channel is important to TAANZ and the engagement of our members is the first step to determining what this might look like and what changes might be made to TAANZ rules to accommodate," says Olsen. "We have a solid agenda and terms of reference for the meeting and look forward to some robust discussion on these important matters."

Scot became the first airline in the world to operate an all-Dreamliner fleet, when its seventh 787 entered scheduled service yesterday. Scot's last 777-200 retired in style with a pyjama party on its final flight on the Singapore-Taipei-Tokyo route. "Since deploying our first Dreamliner in Feb of this year, Scot has transitioned to an all-787 fleet in record time—just seven months. It is therefore appropriate that our latest Dreamliner sports the name 'Lickity-Split', says Scot boss Campbell Wilson.

QF US Fares Extended

Qantas has extended the sales of its US tactical fares through to 12 Sep. Return economy fares are from \$1199 to Los Angeles; San Francisco from \$1299; Dallas from \$1499; and New York from \$1649.

Cruise Ex AKL To The Arctic Circle

Holidaymakers can escape winter and head to the Land of the Midnight Sun in 2017, when Princess Cruises' Sea Princess embarks on the first ever cruise ex Australia to the Arctic Circle.

The itinerary will take clients to four ports in the Nordic region and Arctic Circle as part of a 104-night global circumnavigation.

Announcing details this week, Princess Cruises said Sea Princess would visit 39 ports in 26 countries after setting sail from Sydney 20 May 2017. Cruising via the Middle East to Europe and the UK, Sea Princess will make calls to the Lofoten Islands, Tromso, Honningsvag and Akureyri in the Arctic Circle before visiting North and South America and the Pacific on her return to Australia.

Roundtrip departures are available ex Sydney, Fremantle and Auckland, with fares priced from AUD20,999 for the full world cruise.

The cruise line has also launched the itinerary for its second 2017 world cruise, a 75-night Circle Pacific itinerary which for the first time will be offered on the Golden Princess. 
