Airport Strikes Set Over Holiday Peak

Proposed strikes by New Zealand aviation security workers are expected to cause widespread delays at Auckland and Wellington airports over the school holiday peak. The Public Service Association, representing Aviation Security workers last night announced that AvSec staff had voted for three-hour strikes at Auckland and Wellington airports; and to enforce a ban on overtime and extra hours at Wellington and Christchurch airports later this month.

Today aviation industry stakeholders including Auckland Airport and the New Zealand Civil Aviation Authority were evaluating the impact of the proposed industrial action.

The PSA says its members are very reluctant to strike, but that they feel they have no choice after pay negotiations stalled earlier this month, as passenger numbers (and the government agency's budget surplus) rise.

An Auckland Airport spokesman says that it is in discussions on the potential impact of the strikes, if they go ahead, and how it could best manage operations on those days to minimise the disruption to travellers.

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At the same time Prime Minister John Key has said that the government may potentially look to intervene if the strikes are not averted. However, the Police Association has reportedly dismissed the possibility of its officers stepping in to help at airports over the strikes as 'ludicrous'.

The Civil Aviation Authority of New Zealand was due to make a statement on the situation this afternoon.

... TAANZ

TAANZ boss Andrew Olsen says the proposed industrial action is 'a very intentional consequence which will affect people who are not involved and once again travellers are paying the price'. Olsen says the move is a bad look for New Zealand and its capability to handle national issues, in this case pay disputes, that affect our very good air networks. "Again TAANZ emphasises the need to leave the traveller alone whether it be levies or industrial action," he says.

... Strike Dates

The AvSec airport worker strikes are proposed in AKL: 20 Jul 1000-1330; 25 Jul, 1530-1830; and 27 Jul, 0530-0830. In WLG: 20 Jul, 1000–1330; 22 Jul, 1530–1830; and 26 Jul, 0530-0830. An overtime and extra hours ban is also in place all day over the strike dates. CHC workers will also enforce overtime/extra hours ban all day 20 Jul, 25 Jul and 27 Jul.

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Exploring SFO With UA/NZ SFO Ready For Spike In Kiwi Arrivals



San Francisco is gearing up for an influx of Kiwis following the introduction of new flights to the city including United Airlines' inaugural flight from Auckland, which launched on Sun.

San Francisco Travel is hopeful the flights will bring both first and repeat visitors from New Zealand to the city, and says it will be promoting the opportunities the new flights offer through upcoming trade missions as well as working with airlines on promotional content, events and famils. With Air New Zealand seeing high loads when the America's Cup was held in the city, the city's tourism board is hoping for similar load factors when the city hosts the Rugby Sevens at the AT&T Park in San Francisco and Avaya Stadium in San Jose in 2018.

... Airport Welcome

San Francisco Airport too is thrilled with the additional capacity to Auckland, says director of international marketing and aviation development Melissa Andretta.

"The Auckland-San Francisco market has been growing steadily for years," she says. NZ started the route in 2004 with three flights a week, and this has increased to 10 a week during peak times. With UA the pair will each offer seven flights a week, she says.

Andretta says SFO offers an attractive gateway to the US for a variety of reasons, including its size, connections and quirky extras like yoga rooms and welcome dogs.

"SFO is an ideal airport for Kiwis to use when connecting to various destinations in the US and Canada," says Andretta. "Our manageable size, amenities to enjoy while waiting and large number of non-stop flights makes it a refreshing place to transfer. In addition, for those who have longer stopovers it is very easy to get in and out of the city for a short visit via public transportation with the BART train system located directly in the airport."

SFO offers non-stop flights to more than 44 international cities on 38 international carriers, and 78 US cities on 13 domestic airlines.

In-flight Wi-Fi

Satellite-based Wi-Fi is offered on all United Airlines long-haul international aircraft. It costs USD16.99 for the entire AKL-SFO flight.

New SFO Airport Hotel

Hyatt Hotels has entered into an agreement with San Francisco International Airport to manage a 350-room Grand Hyatt hotel on the airport grounds.

Grand Hyatt San Francisco International Airport is expected to open in mid-2019, and will sit on a 4.7 acre site close to terminal buildings with direct accessibility via an AirTrain station to the terminals. The hotel will also offer flexible meeting space, a 24/7 business centre, health club and spa, indoor heated pool, whirlpool, and sauna, and food and beverage offerings including both full-service and casual restaurants, wine and sushi bar, and a rooftop cocktail lounge.

Escape To Alcatraz, But Book In Advance

A must for first-time visitors to San Francisco is the famous prison of Alcatraz, which sits on an island in the middle of the bay and can be reached by regular ferry services.

Alcatraz may have been an unforgiving and unwelcoming home to prisoners but catch the landmark on a sunny day and it's a surprisingly pretty rock to wander (but urge clients to wrap up warm, even in the middle of summer). It also offers stunning views of San Francisco.

Once visitors catch the ferry to the former prison, they can wander the grounds or take a self-guided audio tour which tells the stories of famous prisoners and escape attempts.

The tours book out in advance so clients should book ahead, particularly in summer. In Jan-Mar, it's quieter and easier to secure last-minute tickets. See alcatrazcruises.com
