Confusion Over Sth Africa Visa Rules

The industry has been left scrambling for information after an apparent announcement from South Africa that New Zealanders will need visas to enter the country from Jan—and they'll need to travel to Wellington to get them.

The announcement was made by Minister of Home Affairs Malusi Gigaba at a media conference and shared on Twitter by the Department of Home Affairs. "New Zealand diplomatic, official and ordinary passport holders who arrive at a South African port of entry on or after 16 Jan 2017 and who are not in possession of a visa for the intended purpose and duration of stay, will not be allowed entry into South Africa," says Gigaba.

Kiwis will need to visit dha.gov.za to find out what documents they need, then visit the South African High Commission in Wellington 'to submit a visa application form and supporting documents in person', says Gigaba. The move is in retaliation to the New Zealand Government tightening up its own visa requirements. Kiwis and South Africans have enjoyed visa free travel since 1996, but in Sep New Zealand introduced new requirements, saying too many South Africans were being refused entry at the border.

Gigaba says South Africa has for some time 'adopted a visa policy which is based on the principle of reciprocity', and so a decision was made

to withdraw the visa exemption. South African visas cost ZAR425 for most categories and ZAR1520 for work and business visas, although these will increase in due course 'to align with inflation', says Gigaba. He also noted the application for a New Zealand visa costs 'almost four times the amount', but says he has 'decided not to reciprocate on that matter'.

... Confusion

Airlines and wholesalers spoken to today hadn't received any official announcement of the new policy and are seeking more information.

World Journeys director Ange Pirie said enquiries to the High Commission and South Africa Tourism haven't provided any clarification, 'particularly with regard to the unprecedented requirement to apply for a tourist visa in person, in Wellington'.


"World Journeys, in partnership with other principals, will be doing all possible, from a tourism perspective, to initiate an objection in the hope of overturning this decision," she says.

Calls by *Travel Today* to the High Commission went unanswered, and SA Tourism's Australasia office said it hadn't received anything official.

Industry sources said the move as it stands will have a negative impact on tourism to South Africa, particularly if visitors need to travel to Wellington for their visa.

Strike Closes Eiffel

The Eiffel Tower closed Tue (local time) due to a strike which could extended through to Wed (local time), say reports.

Tower management told *Associated Press* that the workers are 'disconnected from reality' and don't understand the current environment in Paris, where tourism is suffering following terror attacks, floods and air pollution. Visitor numbers to the tower have dropped from around seven million last year to six million this year, AP reported.

A note on the tower's official website reads 'due to a social movement, the Eiffel Tower is closed for the moment'.

KLM/AF Departs

It is further understood that Sandy Stewart, the sole staff member in New Zealand, has been made redundant, effective 31 Dec.

Air Seoul On Sabre

Korea's newest low-cost carrier, Air Seoul, has signed a distribution agreement with Sabre which will make the carrier's content available to agents via the GDS for the first time. Air Seoul launched earlier this year, commencing domestic flights between Gimpo and Jeju in Jul, and last month launched international operations with routes to Japan and Cambodia.

Flight Centre Loses ACCC Case, Again

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) has won a long-running case against Flight Centre, after the High Court overturned a decision made in Flight Centre's favour in 2015.

The ACCC accused Flight Centre of price fixing on six occasions from 2005 to 2009, by asking airlines not to offer prices directly to travellers that were lower than those available on Flight Centre's website.

Flight Centre was found guilty and fined AUD11 million in Dec 2013. This was overturned by the Federal Court last year—but this morning, the High Court overturned the Federal Court decision.

Flight Centre has previously called the case a 'competition law test case' and maintained it did nothing illegal by seeking the best deals for its customers. The company said this morning it is reviewing the latest judgement and hopes to provide an update later today.



Drink The Plane Dry

The pilot of a 3.5 hour Southwest Airlines flight from California to Kansas City was so impressed that passengers managed to drink all of the alcohol onboard that he made an announcement just to congratulate them all. Reports say the majority of those onboard were American football fans travelling to support the Oakland Raiders in their match against the Kansas City Chiefs.

LH/SQ Approval

The Competition Commission of Singapore has approved Singapore Airlines' joint venture with the Lufthansa Group, says SQ. The decision follows approval from Australia, and is 'another step that will enable the two airline groups to build an integrated alliance'.

"We welcome the approval from the CCS and look forward to working with the Lufthansa Group to bring more benefits to customers through harmonisation of our respective networks," says SQ boss Goh Choon Phong. The JV will provide 'unparalleled network connectivity between Europe and Asia Pacific', he says.

New oneworld Fare

The oneworld alliance has released a new three continent fare for the first time from selected southern hemisphere origins including New Zealand and Australia, Qantas has advised. Travel is permitted between the South West Pacific, Africa and South America. Fares are offered in economy and business class. See qantas.co.nz/agents

WRE Overhaul Complete

Whangarei Airport can now host more passengers and accommodate larger aircraft following the completion of a \$1 million upgrade, says Transport Minister Simon Bridges. The overhaul includes extra seating space for passengers, new bathrooms, and a larger internal baggage claim area; while outside, there's more taxi ranks and footpaths, and upgraded pathways. There's also a second airport entry and a car park extension.

On the tarmac, aircraft taxiways have been resurfaced to better accommodate the larger aircraft now operating at the airport.

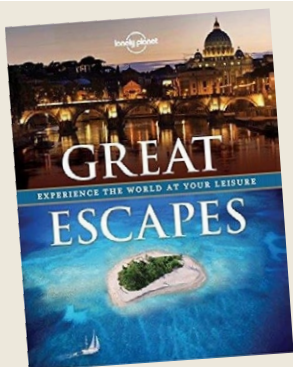

New Air Canada Services

Air Canada will launch six new non-stop US services in 2017. Three of the routes, Toronto to San Antonio, Memphis and Savannah, bring new destinations into the airline's US network, while the addition of Montreal to Dallas-Fort Worth, Vancouver to Denver and the conversion of the Vancouver-Phoenix route to year-round operation, will deepen the airline's trans-border schedule. The new services will be operated by Air Canada Express, starting in May, and continue year-round, except for Toronto-Savannah, which will operate on a (northern) summer seasonal basis.

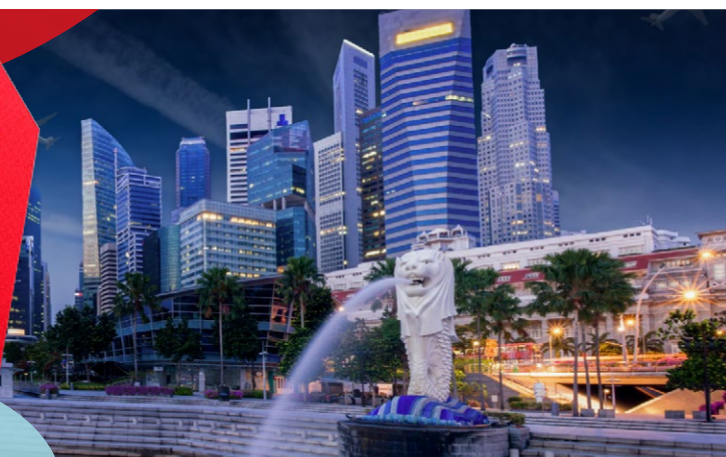

Quito to Cuzco

Adventure World has a new itinerary combining two of its best-selling destinations, Galapagos and Machu Picchu. The new 14-day Galapagos and Machu Picchu Discovery has an emphasis on history, scenery and nature, and travels from Quito to Cuzco, exploring Galapagos, Lima, Yucay and Machu Picchu. LHR's Runway Plans

Heathrow is looking to formally submit an application to expand the airport with a new runway in 2019. The news follows the UK government's announcement in Oct that a new runway at Heathrow is its preferred option for airport expansion. The airport is now set to undertake engagement and consultation with local communities and other stakeholders and various aspects of the scheme including environmental impacts and project design.

New SYD Airport Gets Green Light

The Australian government has given its tick of approval on the Western Sydney Airport plan, to be located at Badgerys Creek—and it's a move that has been welcomed by the Tourism & Transport Forum Australia.

TTF says the 'historic' decision will transform Western Sydney and provide additional aviation capacity for Australia to take advantage of the growth in the Asia-Pacific. "We've had so many false starts on this critical aviation project that very few thought we would ever see the day when the Federal Government gave the green light for a Western Sydney Airport at Badgerys Creek to be built – but here we are at last," says TTF chief executive Margy Osmond.

She adds that the airport has the potential to fundamentally change the way Sydney operates, but that the right infrastructure will need to be put in place to connect it to the Sydney CBD and the broader Western Sydney region. "TTF has been a vocal advocate of building transport infrastructure including fast rail to the new airport to ensure it can reach its full potential," she says. "I've said before we don't want it to become a 'hitchhiker's' airport—we must have an ironclad plan to deliver rail as soon as possible."

Reports say the airport is expected to

be up and running in the mid-2020s and would be expected to initially service around 10 million passengers a year. It is due to operate with a single runway upon opening, with a second parallel runway expected to be required by 2050, say reports. For details see westernsydneyairport.gov.au

Virgin Space Flight



Virgin Galactic's new spaceship, the VSS Unity, successfully completed its first free flight last week—and says it's 'an important step forward on our road to space'.

It's more than two years since one of Virgin's space ships crashed, killing

the co-pilot. The latest test flight over the Mojave Desert marks the first time a vehicle built by sister organisation, The Spaceship Company, has flown fully under its own control.

The glide flight was the first of many, and Virgin Galactic says it hasn't yet reached the rocket powered phase of the test flight program. It hasn't given any update on when the more than 700 prospective astronauts, including around eight from New Zealand, will finally get to space.
