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India stopovers, niche travel boost for agents

Encouraging clients to stopover in India on the way to Europe could result in a substantial follow-up booking to the exotic and colourful destination a year or two later, agents attending the Incredible India functions this week are being told.

'If agents get their clients to spend four or five days getting a taste of India, those clients will want to do three weeks next year – they will want to go back for more,' says Jenny Burt, sales manager New Zealand with Air India. 'So encourage them to stop and see the Taj Mahal or Jaipur on the way to Europe.

Burt says Air India is pushing stopover opportunities to the New Zealand trade as well as niche travel and VFR (visiting friends and relatives).

A delegation from India, as well as local operators specialising in the destination, hosted an Auckland function at The Zing in Auckland on Wednesday, and at Zaika Restaurant in Wellington last night.

Kanchan Kukreja, assistant director India Tourism based in Sydney, says New Zealand is a small but important and growing market for the country.

Close to 51,000 New Zealanders visited in 2016, a 12.7%

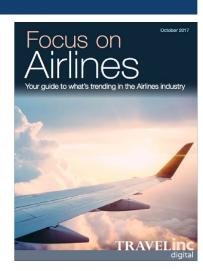

The company says the smog is being inappropriately labelled as general pollution.

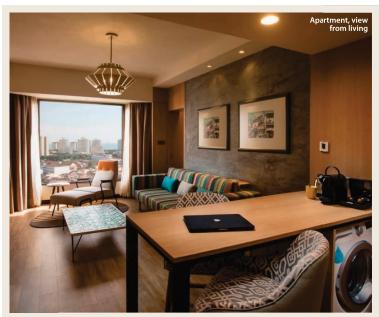

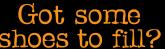

Off-season travel likely to be big trend

A move towards offseason travel is one of the trends Trafalgar's chief executive officer Gavin Tollman believes will emerge next year and beyond.

'The numbers of travellers are growing annually, dramatically.

Clearly, however, in key cities, the industry can't build accommodation fast enough to accommodate high season peaks, and travelling on your own can result in long queues that simply exhaust the desire to fulfil a travel dream,' says Tollman.

'You will also see more. Without traffic and queues one acquires more time and the opportunity to discover a whole new range of activities. 'Finally, there are the prices. From air to activities to transport, depending on time of year and season, rates can vary significantly. Discounts are for times of low demand.'
