

She says Antarctica has a couple of different journeys that guests can experience, while the Arctic has some seven or eight.



## Singapore Airlines rebuilds its app

A ground-up rebuild of the Singapore Airlines mobile app has resulted in enhanced booking and check-in flows, improving transaction time by up to 60%.

New features include Capture & Discover, a search function that uses image recognition as well as speech and natural language processing to identify the user intent, match it to a Singapore Airlines destination, and present relevant destination content and fare deals.

A new Translation Assistant feature uses real-time language translation by voice, and Measure Your Baggage helps determine whether cabin baggage is within size limitations.

The existing My Trips function has improved real-time information such as boarding gate details, the destination's weather and

currency, and baggage belt details.

The in-flight entertainment function has extended access to e-Library magazine and newspaper content based on the user's KrisFlyer membership tier, as well as a new search and filter function to allow for easier content browsing in the e-Library and KrisWorld catalogue. Customers can still bookmark their movies so that they can pick up where they left off on subsequent flights.

For Android users, the new app is being released by countries progressively between July and September 2019, while iOS users may download the new app from the App Store in September 2019.



'We will continue to update our trade partners and any passengers affected by this situation, and thank them for their support while we resolve this matter.' says Devries.

## A 'lively' trip to Colombia

Viva Expeditions' recent press trip to Colombia explored the colonial cities as well as the Caribbean beaches.

There was one experience that guests were not expecting – a game of Tejo, Colombia's traditional throwing sport. It is characteristic for its use of small targets containing gunpowder, which explode on impact. For fans of darts, bowling, alcohol or explosives, this mixes everything into a noisy night out.

Players hurl tejos (weighted steel discs) towards a bocin (metal ring) that is rigged with gunpowder-stuffed mechas. Contained within a wooden box, roughly one metre square, the circular bocin contains paper triangles filled with gunpowder, or mechas. The aim of the game is to throw a tejo to hit the mechas, causing them to explode and bring the team closer to victory.

Modern tejo is based on a game that was developed in Turmequé, Boyaca, Colombia more than 450 years ago. The Spanish



likely left their own explosive mark on tejo by contributing the characteristic gunpowder-filled mechas element. This may have saved the sport because, unlike many other elements of pre-European, indigenous, and native South American culture, tejo is now widespread in modern Colombia.

## **Caño Cristales reopens**

Colombia's River of Five Colours (Caño Cristales) has reopened to tourism, reports Viva Expeditions. The Serranía de la Macarena National Park, home to Caño Cristales, was closed to tourists in December 2018 after a prolonged drought.

Until recently the area was deemed offlimits to tourists by the government due to the risk of FARC (Revolutionary Armed Forces of Colombia) activity.

The 80km river flows through a narrow gorge that levels out onto stone terraces. The river is best viewed between July and November when the water levels are high and cover the algae. During the rainy season the river rises and the aquatic plants grow in bright and varied colours.




